The 'Goal' of the Catechism: Jesus, the Way

A new Adult Instruction Class has just begun—each Sunday after the Divine Service, 10:50 am in the Founder's Room. Attending are new faces to St. Paul's, some joining us from other churches or new to the area; others are longtime members glad to review the basics of Christian Doctrine. As we teach the Faith—with Bible, Hymnal and Small Catechism in hand—we introduce the simple, familiar order of the Six Chief Parts that you know from Luther's little book: from The Ten Commandments, to The Creed, The Lord's Prayer, Baptism, Office of the Keys to the culmination to which the other five teachings bring us: the 6th Chief Part: the Body and Blood of Jesus in The Sacrament of the Altar.

I don't know a single pastor who doesn't love to teach this class and rejoice to see hearts and minds opened to God's Promises and gracious gifts. Over the years, I have *also* come to appreciate teaching these same Six Chief Parts in the way (and *order*) in which we actually find them in the Divine Service each week: **Baptism**, **Office of the Keys**, **Ten Commandments**, **Creed**, **Lord's Prayer** ... to the Altar for **the Sacrament**.

Think of it this way: St. John's *Revelation* (22:14) announces, "Blessed are those who wash their robes, so that they may have the right to the Tree of Life and that they may enter the City by the gates." In one verse—the last chapter of the Bible!—John describes the entire catechism as well as the very structure of the Divine Service and how we worship. He declares that the purpose of Baptism (i.e. "washing" your robes in the Blood of the Lamb, *cf.* 7:14) is to bring you through heaven's gate into heaven's city so that you may eat from the Tree of Life. But what is the Tree of Life?

The Cross! St. Paul connects Jesus' death-cross to a "tree" in Gal 3:13 (by quoting Deut. 21:23, "Cursed is everyone who is hanged on a tree"), saying that, by hanging there in our place, Jesus "became a curse [before God] for us." St. John in his Gospel shows us that the "fruit" of *that* "tree" is the Body and Blood of Jesus: "Whoever feeds on My Flesh and drinks My Blood has eternal life, and I will raise him up on the Last Day. For My Flesh is true food, and My Blood is true drink" (John 6:54-55). The *Cross* is the real Tree of *Life*, that which brings Life to you.

God wants to bring as many people as possible into His city to eat from this Tree (notice those who are staying outside the "city," Rev 22:15). His goal is to make mortal, sinful man *im*mortal and holy. But how can this be done ... for anyone ... when the moment anything *un*holy comes into the *holy* presence of God ... it is destroyed (e.g. As the prophet Isaiah feared: "Woe is me! For I am lost; for I am a man of unclean lips, ... [and] my eyes have seen the King, the LORD of hosts!," Is. 6:5)?

God had to devise a way that would cleanse man from sin so that he could pass through the gate and eat from the Tree, face to face with God. That "Way" is Christ. That "Way" is laid out in the Catechism. That "Way" is carried out in the Divine Service.

Enough for now! Next month we'll look at each of the Six Chief Parts of Christian Doctrine as we come to them each Sunday in the Divine Service—the Christian life experienced as we gather each week in Christ Jesus.

A Campaign to Engage Faith Communities in Suicide Prevention

Let's be honest: life can sometimes feel overwhelming. The loss of a job or a relationship, trouble in school, a serious mental or physical illness, a divorce, or the death of a loved one can happen to anyone. Life events like these can leave us feeling unworthy, abandoned, or isolated. The last two years of living through a global pandemic has only increased such feelings for many of us.

Saint Paul's seeks to be a caring community focused on helping one another and loving our neighbors, especially in difficult times. Through connections within our own community, we find strength for each day. Each of us is here for a reason and has a God -given role in life, regardless of our current circumstances. Moment by moment, it is important to remember there is help, hope, and reasons to live.

Whoever you are, whatever you are facing, God loves you. God knows your struggles and failures, as well as your joys and triumphs. Even when you walk through the valleys of the shadows, God is with you. In the times when it feels like God is far away or doesn't hear our prayers, God gives us people who can help—friends, loved ones, co-workers, others in your faith community, your pastors, and clinical professionals, such as counselors, therapists, and doctors. These people can be God's heart and God's listening ear when we feel most troubled or alone. If you, or someone you know has lost hope, is feeling completely alone, or that life doesn't matter, reach out for help. Let others help. This is especially important if someone is experiencing thoughts of suicide.
