

Stewardship Moments for the Easter Season

Jesus' well-known statement in today's Gospel that he is the "Good Shepherd" is quite obviously a reference to that familiar psalm that many of us know by heart, "The Lord is my shepherd." That's not the only place in the Scriptures where you can find the imagery of sheep and shepherd. Both Jeremiah and Ezekiel speak of the true shepherd God will provide to lead his people.

So why do the Scriptures liken us to sheep? Isn't that a tad bit demeaning? Maybe it's because in certain ways we actually are like them. Sheep are, for example, notoriously near-sighted, meaning that they are oblivious to the danger posed by a wolf prowling off in the distance. Like them, we need a shepherd who watches out for us. Or, consider the fact that if a sheep gets separated from the flock, it pretty much freezes with fear. Typically, a shepherd can't coax the sheep to move along but has to pick it up and carry it home.

What a beautiful image of our Lord Jesus. Having laid down his life for you, his beloved sheep, he is utterly committed to you. Like a noble, heroic shepherd, he carries you through the dark valley of this life. So listen for his voice. Commit yourself to going to church every Sunday. And invite your friends and neighbors to get to know this Good Shepherd as well. There is no better friend, no better Lord.

St. Paul's Heritage Hall Renovation/Expansion Project Update

Many exciting changes are in the works at St. Paul's. You are likely all aware of the upcoming renovation and expansion project planned for Heritage Hall. We anticipate construction work to begin at the end of May with completion anticipated by approximately July or August of 2025. Much work has already been done to empty out Heritage Hall and thank you to all the faithful volunteers who have assisted with this effort. However, much work remains to be completed between now and the end of May to prepare for construction!

Anticipated Schedule

April 20th

*Estate Sale (9am – 5pm)

April 22nd – 26th

*Remaining items not sold in estate sale to be sent to a local auction house.

April 29th – May 18th

- *Remaining items to be kept will be boxed and stored in the sanctuary basement.
- *Volunteers will be needed to assist with moving items to the basement.

May 21st -23rd

- *Church office staff as well as Pastor Cage's office will move to the Indiana District Office. All necessary items including copiers, files and supporting equipment will be moved. The District Office is being very accommodating in preparation for this move and St. Paul's is grateful for their cooperation. The church phone number and email access will remain the same.
- *Member access to the church office staff will be very limited and on an appointment basis only. We must make every effort to minimize disruption to the Indiana District Office staff during this time.
- *Pastor Hoem has already moved his office to the school.

May 29th

*Asbestos abatement and initial demolition are scheduled to begin.

Construction Items to note

- 1. Restrooms will remain available during the entire construction process for use during services. Access will be through the west cloister hallway. No other access will be available during construction. The elevator and east cloister entrances will be closed.
- 2. Approximately the west 1/3 of the north parking lot will be unavailable for parking as it will be needed for construction material storage and project staging.
