# **Grace and Peace**

What great news! Grace and peace are ours, as St. Paul writes in Galatians 1: 3. In his commentary on Galatians (Luther's Works, vol. 26, p. 26), Martin Luther writes, "These two words, 'grace' and 'peace,' contain a summary of all Christianity". We so desperately need this good news as we hear of the wars and bloodshed in the Mideast, and throughout the world, or as we face the difficulties and problems of life in this sin-darkened world, or even in times of extreme stress and worry in our lives.

In his Epistle to the Galatians, St. Paul wants us to have grace and peace — not from Caesar or from kings and princes nor from the world, but from God our Father. The apostle clearly distinguishes our Lord's grace and peace from any other kind of worldly grace and peace. He means that worldly types of grace and peace do not last and cannot help us or deliver us from trouble, despair, and death.

God's Word is the good news, that grace forgives sin and peace stills the conscience.

Christ has won the victory, and His people enjoy the fullness of His grace – that is, forgiveness of our sins and therefore a joyful peace of mind, heart, and body. As Luther tells us: "Therefore your bones and mine will know no rest until we hear the Word of grace and cling to it firmly and faithfully" (LW, vol. 26, p. 27).

Grace to you and peace from God the Father and our Lord Jesus Christ.
