Update: Siberian Lutheran Mission Society As of Sunday, February 2, St. Paul's has raised \$3,160 for the Siberian Evangelical Lutheran Church and Seminary. We still need \$6,840 to reach our \$10,000 goal. However, with the matching gift from an anonymous donor our actual current total is \$6,320. The overall goal among many congregations and individuals in Fort Wayne and surrounding areas working together is \$120,000. St. Paul's is endeavoring to raise \$10,000 toward the \$120,000.
